Summer Topical Series #10 'Opening the Gates of Jerusalem' Psalm 96:1-6; 122:1-9

0.0 Introduction

- 0.1 Gates of the city in classical times: essential ingress/egress, needing defense in wartime
- 0.2 Walled "old city" of Jerusalem today has eight gates (4 in Crusader era), and similar number in Jesus' day (see https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Gates of the Old City of Jerusalem)
- 0.3 The cool side of ancient gates: giant room with two massive double doorways w soldiers; gates essential for daily people movement, incl. trade (hence: 'elders in the gate')
- 0.4 The request the led to all this? How to be drawn into worship
- 1.0 Things to Know About Jerusalem's Gates (in Ps.122)
 - 1.1 One "goes up" to city of Jerusalem, and to the temple mount area (v.1)
 - 1.2 Jerusalem a "compact city" (today 1/3 sq. mile) with multiple gates (vv.2-3)
 - 1.3 The Golden Gate on east side (over Kidron Valley and Mt. of Olives) accesses both city and Temple Mount (facing into Beautiful/Bronze Gate of temple, Ac.3:2,10)
 - 1.4 A central place of worship for all tribes & God-fearers (vv.4-5)
 - 1.5 Well-being of city and eagerness to worship are connected
- 2.0 Things That Obstruct the Gates of Worship
 - 2.1 Civil problems (like Covid) interfere with worship
 - 2.2 Disinterested and distracted people tend to avoid worship (Matt.22:5)
 - 2.3 Individualism diverts from worship
 - 2.4 Our own sin (or frustration at others' sin) suppresses worship
 - 2.5 Cringe response to our sin (per Gen.3:8-10) diverts from worship
 - 2.6 Pride: 'those hypocrites' straw men distract from worship
- 3.0 Things That Open the Gates of Jerusalem
 - 3.1 An expanding vision of our glorious God Ps.96:1-6
 - 3.2 Fear & reverence & need & thankfulness
 - 3.3 Hunger...for knowledge, growth, fellowship (Matt.5:6)

 - 3.5 Family affection (I Jn.4:7; 3:10-18)
