The Other Letter to Ephesus Rev.2:1-7; II Tim.4:5-8

0.0 Introduction

- 0.1 Revelation/Apocalypse the most unusual part of entire New Testament:
 - Revelation is about good vs. evil
 - Revelation uses genre known as "Jewish Apocalyptic" = God prevails
 - Revelation aims to bless and encourage us now
 - Revelation 'recapitulates': "John is repeating his message, the same message, over and over in the Revelation, but in different words." (E. Robson, ad loc, p.69)
- 0.2 That repetition takes form in seven letters to churches (Ch.2-3), in similar writing style:
 - letters sent for various purposes: greet, discuss/argue, commend, explain & instruct
 - we shall spend time with 2/7 in this sermon series
 - letter of Ephesus typical, but especially: to commend (vv.2-3) + to caution (v.4)
 - perhaps some of what they needed then, we need now

1.0 Regarding the Seven Letters

- 1.1 First series block (Rev.2-3): short letters to churches in W. Turkey/Asia Minor (map)
 - Revelation/Apocalypse = to reveal, open up hence commission in 1:11
 - see destination map for these locations (over)
- 1.2 But something strange here: these are letters, but the Apocalypse is not
 - e.g. omissions Laodicea, Hierapolis, Colossae, and likely many more
 - hint at reason lies in choice of seven
- 1.3 The Apocalypse is a book of sevens: menorahs & stars & churches (Rev.1-3), Spirits of God (1:4; 4:5), sealed scrolls (5:1-8:5), angels + trumpets (8:6-11:19), more angels + bowls of plagues (16:1-21) – with an overall "heptadic structure"
- 1.4 In Bible, seven represents God's full presence, total holiness and complete goodness

2.0 Regarding the "Other" Letter to Ephesus

- 2.1 Why Ephesus? Major city of Asia Minor:
 - Neolithic site taken by 10thC BC Greeks as eastward-looking coastal foothold
 - extensive & wealthy city, including 25k theater, 1/7-Wonders Temple to Artemis
 - later: library of Celsus (incl various graffiti, e.g. Jewish menorah ... and Metallica)
- 2.2 Paul ministered here on both 2nd and 3rd missionary journeys c.AD57/58
 - wrote Ephesian epistle, c.AD62; later, also Bishop Ignatius of Antioch, c.AD100
- 2.3 The other letter to believers at Antioch came via apostle John Rev.2:1-7
- 2.4 Parts included: addressee and Sender (v.1), commendation (vv.2-3,6), correction (v.4), counsel & caution (v.5), reminder & promise (v.7)
 - all seven letters in Rev.2-3 align with this formula
- 2.5 What he commended vv.2-3
- 2.6 What he cautioned vv.4-5 → responsive, with faithfulness ... Council, AD431
- 3.0 The Importance of This Ephesian Letter for Us Today
 - 3.1 Quite possible, during your life, to wax & wane in love for God
 - keep an eye out for things which undercut your focus & fortitude (2:4-5)

(over)

- 3.2 God remembers your love and service toward others (2:2a)
- 3.3 We need strength & determination to stand up to evil & tyranny (2:2b)
- 3.4 Encourage others just do it (2:3a; I Thess.5:11; Heb.3:13; 10:25)
- 3.5 We anticipate a 'crown of life' for life (2:7; Matt.25:23; II Tim.4:8)
