1.0 Women in Jesus' Lineage

- 1.1 Eve mother/ancestor of all (Gen.4; Lk.3:38)
- 1.2 Tamar (Matt.1:3), consort of Judah (Gen.38)
- 1.3 Rahab (Jos.2,6) prostitute of Jericho \rightarrow wife of Salmon \rightarrow parents of Boaz
- 1.4 Ruth (Matt.1:5) Moabite daughter-in-law to Naomi \rightarrow later, wife of Boaz (Ruth)
- 1.5 Bathsheba (Matt.1:6) widow of Uriah the Hittite \rightarrow David's 8 wives
- 1.6 Mary his mother (Lk.1:35, etc.) marries into line of David via Joseph (Matt.1:6,16)
- 1.7 Elizabeth, aunt (?) of Mary, & mother of John the Baptist (Lk.1:36)
- 1.8 Salome (relative? Mk.15:40; 16:1)
- 1.9 Two (or more) unnamed sisters (Mk.6:2-3)
- 2.0 What These Women Meant?
 - 2.1 Eve, Mary, Elizabeth & Jesus' (step-?) sisters: establish his true humanity (note Jn.8:41)
 - 2.2 Bathsheba helps connect Jesus to God's covenant with David (II Sam.7)
 - 2.3 Rahab & Ruth outliers & troubled people are especially welcomed!

3.0 The Importance of These Women for Us Today

- 3.1 Jesus was one person with two natures (Tertullian)
- 3.2 Humanly, Jesus was related to marginalized outsiders (who often are 'expendable')
 - God loves to use "stone which builders rejected" (I Pet.2:7)
 - no one has to prove themselves by honorable lineage (or anything else) nor can they
